12/103 Public Speaking

A parishioner mentioned that the stake is not high enough for the newly planted Oak tree on Stanley recreation ground. Councillor Harvey confirmed this is being looked into.

A parishioner reported that the railway cutting footpath/permissive path off Station Road, Stanley at the bridge is holding water which is becoming stagnant. The Horsechestnut fencing by the bridge also has gaps in it. It was resolved to report these items.

A parishioner has been storing the top two tiers of the cascade and commented that they were past their sell by date and suggested scrapping them. A parishioner complained about the maintenance of the planters. A site visit had been undertaken with the contractor, Councillor Harvey and Mr Hallam, however the planters had still not been finished. It was resolved to follow this up with the Contractor. The Chair thanked Mr Hallam for his help and support especially with these issues.

Councillor McGraw mentioned problems with parking and the footpath around Eventide Hall and road markings have been agreed. There have also been complaints about damaged verges on Hayeswood Road. Any suggestions and supporting information to solve the problems would be appreciated.

A parishioner asked who is responsible for mowing the verges. They were concerned that Common Lane and Dale Road were cut back early stopping the growth of wild flowers.

Ian Marsden Consultation Officer from Erewash Borough Council gave a presentation on working together. Erewash Borough Council had recently completed a review of their Community Forum meetings. This review involved over 1,000 Erewash residents sharing their views on what they would like to see in the future. One area that they were keen for the Borough Council to develop was a stronger link to the thirteen Parish Councils located within the Erewash borough. As Consultation Officer one of Ian's main roles is to engage with the community in ways that work best. Residents have suggested that the Parish Councils would be a good way of engaging with more rural based residents to enable Erewash Borough Council to find out what those people think about living in Erewash. The website, Stanley's magazine and working with other local groups were suggested as a way to strengthen the working relationship between the Parish and Borough Council.

Councillor Cheetham confirmed that the original comments from the Parish Council had remained un-changed.

12/112 Hedge cutting and Fallow Field

The Fallow Field Smalley Common is mown each year by Mr Neil Woolley. He takes the hay and repays Council by paying for the hedge to be cut in winter. He also trims the pavement side in between as and when necessary to keep the footpath clear, this agreement began in July 2011 and Councillor Wood had confirmed that Mr Woolley is happy for this arrangement to continue.

12/113 Poplar Tree Replacement

Councillor Harvey reported that there had been feedback from residents not to replace the poplar tree. The recommendation from the working party was not to replace the tree taking into consideration the poor drainage on site. There is a large diameter culvert pipe running close to and parallel with the east boundary of the playing field that takes brook water from land north of the end of Coronation Road to eventually discharge to Stanley Brook. Councillor Cheetham and Rhodes proposed to plant another tree. It was agreed to plant a replacement for the poplar tree some time in the future at a site to be agreed.

12/114 Withdrawal of the Bulls Corner Planter/Replacement

The Bulls Corner planter was thought to have been donated to the Parish Council, however there is no record of this. The owner had requested the return of the planter and a letter was sent asking for it to be removed by the 15 June. A telephone message was left for the Clerk on the 19 June confirming the owner did not want the planter back and had no means of disposing of the planter and therefore the Parish Council could dispose of the planter. It was resolved to send a letter acknowledging this and thanking the owner for the use of it for the past 10 years. It was resolved to purchase a new planter to replace the withdrawn planter at Bulls Corner at a cost of £272.50 + VAT from Countrywide.

12/122 Public Speaking

PC Crooks asked for volunteers for a Speed Watch to contact himself, details are on the Parish Council website. 12/125 Co-Option of Parish Councillor

Councillor Cheetham confirmed that the procedure for the Parish Councillor vacancy had been followed and the Parish Council were now in a position to co-opt. There was one applicant for the vacant position and Alan Derrett was co-opted unanimously and duly completed the Declaration of Acceptance of Office of Parish Councillor.

12/128 Chairmans Announcements

Councillor Cheetham reported on the recent article in the Ilkeston Advertiser regarding the second Parish Councillor vacancy. Erewash Borough Council had received a valid request to organise an election to fill the vacancy. Councillor Cheetham confirmed that this is totally in accordance with the democratic process and the Parish Council supports this. If no one offers their services then the process must continue until someone is elected as the vacancy cannot now be filled by co-option. If more than two people stand for this vacancy there has to be a formal election. This will cost the Parish Council £2700 which includes the cost of £500 for polling cards which were agreed. Councillor Cheetham advised that the Parish Council are required to hold a reserve of funds for emergencies. This is based on a percentage of the precept, which is not more than 50% (£6500) and not less than 25% (£3750) the normal practice has been to hold £4200 as reserve. If an election does take place the cost will come from this reserve which will necessarily need to be replaced and this will be done by way of an increase in the precept which will equate to approximately £3 per household throughout the parish.

The Parish Council noted a letter in the Ilkeston Advertiser from a lady on Belper Road Stanley Common thanking the Parish Council on the Trim Trail that has recently been installed.

12/129 Dog Control Orders

Erewash Borough Council are in the second phase of the consultation regarding Dog Control Orders. Maps indicating the boundaries of the proposed Dog Control Order areas and a report giving details of the proposed Dog Control Orders had been received. Councillor Harvey reported that it is the gated play areas in Stanley and Stanley Common recreation grounds where dog exclusion orders have been included as part of the consultation process. The Parish Council have already adopted this stance, however the Parish Council would also consider supporting a byelaw for all dogs on leads on the recreation grounds. It was resolved to refer this to the Recreation Grounds Working Party.

12/130 Dates for village consultations/Community Consultation Letter

It was resolved to book the Scout Hut at Stanley Common on the 24 October and Stanley Village Hall on the 26 October between 7.00-9.00 pm.

It was agreed that if the Parish Council had any comments on the Community Consultation letter to report back to Councillor Wood within the next two weeks.

It was resolved to approach the Scouts to deliver the consultation information and Councillor Wint agreed to follow this up to ensure a fair donation for their services. A budget of £500 was agreed to include printing, envelopes, delivery, notepads etc with the consultation information to be delivered approximately a week and a half before the consultation dates. Councillor Wood offered to obtain quotes for the printing.

12/131 Christmas Tree/Lights approval/Concert details

It was resolved to accept the quote from Mr Christmas Tree for two Christmas Trees £110 + VAT each/Leisure Lites to install/remove the Christmas trees £1530 + VAT including the PAT testing of the Christmas tree light transformers. The Salvation Army band concert has been organised for the 30 November to include the light switching on at both Stanley and Stanley Common at 7.00 pm followed by the concert at 7.30 pm in Stanley Village Hall. It was resolved to donate £100 to the Salvation Army and purchase £30 sweets for the children. It was agreed to ask the Stanley Gala Princess to turn the lights on in Stanley and Brian Bunting to turn on the lights at Stanley Common. The event posters and carol sheets will be updated.

12/132 Speed signs for Stanley recreation ground

It was reported that a child had run across car park towards trim trail in front of car at Stanley recreation, however no further details of the incident were available. It was resolved to purchase a suitable warning sign and attach to the wall at the side of the gates.

12/133 Replacement bollards Stanley recreation ground

It was agreed to defer this until the September meeting.

12/134 Morley Lane – Drainage/Road surface issues

It was agreed to defer this until the September meeting.

12/135 Bulls Corner Planter

Countrywide had failed to complete the summer planting in good time and resolve various issues despite a site meeting on the 25.5.12 and follow up e-mails/telephone calls, with the latest phone call being made on the 3 July by the Clerk and no response to date back from Countrywide. The planter from Countrywide had been ordered on the 10 June and despite chasing this via e-mail and telephone Countrywide had failed to communicate its progress and therefore it was resolved to cancel the order. Councillor Harvey reported that a volunteer had offered to remove and dispose of the old planter and help had also been offered to turn this into a raised flower bed. Councillor Wint offered to donate some bedding plants.

12/136 Adoption of Code of Conduct

It was resolved to adopt the Erewash Borough Council Code of Conduct. The Parish Council had not received the new disclosable pecuniary interest forms from EBC so were unable to complete.

12/137 Hayes Wood Road Grassed Area problem and possible remedy

Councillor McGraw had e-mailed regarding issues on Hayes Wood Road especially, the corners of the green as there is a problem for drivers negotiating the tight corners especially for the refuse lorry. This has caused unsightly craters in the grass particularly the edges of the green. Councillor McGraw had asked if it was possible for DCC and EBC to consider decreasing the size of the Green/tidying up the road area/Green area. - DCC Update on Common Lane – Further to your e-mail requesting DCC erect tractor warning signs, "passing place" signs, additional "not suitable for wide vehicles" signs and to reduce the speed limit to 30mph. *I have visited the site to investigate your concerns. In erecting new signs DCC has to ensure that they are appropriate and effective. To be most effective they should be used sparingly. Their frequent use to warn of conditions which are readily apparent tends to bring them into disrepute and detracts from their effectiveness. As Common Lane is very obviously a country lane with many rural features, it is not considered appropriate to erect tractor warning signs. Further, it is also a feature of country lanes that they are narrow; as this is the case, it would not be appropriate to erect "passing place" signs along and at each end the lane. As there are already "unsuitable for wide vehicles" signs at the Stanley end of the lane, it is appropriate to erect such signs at the Stanley Common end. I will arrange for such signs to be erected in due course. Although the lane is subject to the national speed limit, this is a maximum speed and should not be considered as a target speed for drivers. In locations such as Common Lane, the majority of motorists tend to drive appropriately for the conditions. Reducing the speed limit will not necessarily reduce the speed at which motorists drive through Common Lane. Further, for a speed limit to be effective it has to be one which motorists will respect and that the local Police will be able to enforce effectively. Therefore it is more appropriate to leave the speed limit here at the national speed limit, than to reduce it to a limit which will not be appropriate or respected. Whilst appreciating that the PC may not be totally happy with these decisions, I consider that erecting additional "unsuitable for wide vehicles" signs will have the most effect on the driving habits of local residents using Common Lane.*

The 1973 conveyance document states that the area being transferred was 4 acres and two perches. 1 acre = 4,840 sq. yds. and 1 perch = 30.25 sq.yds.

The area of land conveyed as open space therefore = (4 X 4,840) + (2X 30.25) = 19,420.5 sq. yds.
Conversion to metric - 1 sq. yd. = 0.8361 sq. m. (sm.). Therefore the area of land conveyed in sm. =
19,420.5 X 0.8361 = 16,237.5 sm.

One twentieth of this area therefore = 16,237.5 divided by 20 = 812 sm.

The footprint area of the Village Hall = 256 sm. The footprint area of the PC's container = 19.5 sm.

Considering the paved car park area on the basis of what is the actual overall defined parking bay area and therefore not always accessible for pedestrian/recreation use and discounting the remaining paved areas, based on the fact that paving in access pathways, seating areas, terraces and the like are all accepted features found in public open spaces for recreation, the area dedicated/lined-out for parked cars could be reasonably calculated/assessed to be 430 sm.

Using the above areas therefore the area covered by buildings and dedicated parking spaces = (256 + 19.5 + 430) = 705.5 sm.

Therefore the amount remaining of the one twentieth for any future building would be 812 - 705.5 = 106.5 sm.

This is very roughly the area of playing field land between the rear wall of the village hall (full length) and the (undefined/unconfirmed) adjoining owner's ditch playing field north boundary. This area does not readily present itself as having future external recreational use potential so could be seen as reasonably being space for building extension or a replacement PC storage facility.

The village hall drawing extension appears to be 2m x 15 metres.
